Abstract

Turkey’s late and unequal relationship with the broader world economy has concluded in the emergence of an unequal structure in the country. In this respect, the concept of “unequal and combined development” allows us to grasp Turkey’s capitalist development process in a holistic and dynamic way. I will particularly pay attention to the uses of the concept by looking at the nation-building process in Turkey and regional inequalities.
